



Gavrilo Princip Defense: Source Questions

Directions: Go through the accompanying packet with the primary sources and answer the questions on this sheet below

<u>DOCUMENT A:</u> This is a political cartoon that was published in a French magazine about the Bosnian crisis. It depicts how the Bulgarian Tsar and Austro-Hungarian Emperor divided up the territories. The man off to the side is the leader of Turkey.

- 1) If the Bulgarian Tsar and the Austro-Hungarian Emperor are present, why isn't there a figure that represents the people of Bosnia?
- 2) Does it seem like they are dividing the land in a fair way or are they just grabbing up as much as they can pull?

<u>DOCUMENT B:</u> This document is a treaty that was signed that decided how the lands would be divided and who would rule what territories

- 3) Are all the countries mentioned in Article XXV represented on the top of the page under who the treaty is between? Why is it important that this "nation" is excluded?
- 4) If this is a treaty, why does Austria-Hungary want to "reserves the right of keeping garrisons and having military and commercial roads"?

<u>DOCUMENT C:</u> This is a plaque that was put up at the site where Princip assassinated the Archduke

- 5) Why is the wording so important on the plaque? Think about phrases like "people's protest" and "tyranny"
- 6) When a country or nation puts up a plaque like that, does it mean they are proud or ashamed of what happened?
