

# The Age of Trump




Cable news organizations are expected to make a record-breaking 2.5 billion during this election season



The FCC attempted to regulate radio (and later TV) content by trying to break up monopolies and establishing guidelines (the Blue Book) that broadcasters had to meet in order for license renewal.
